Here is an update on our journey to Cairo!

Our homestay will begin on Wednesday, Oct. 17 and conclude on Wednesday, Oct. 24.



The itinerary for the amazing journey available following the homestay in Cairo is detailed on pages 2 and 3 of this newsletter. Egypt requires a visa for \$25 USD issued at the point of entry and is good for 30 days. Jordan requires a visa for \$56 USD (about) also good for 30 days and Israel does not charge US citizens for entry. **All three countries ask that you have a blank passport page**. Our host fee is \$175 per ambassador and we have an FFI fee of about the same amount. We will donate some amount (\$50-\$100) per person to a charity of their choosing. So ballpark figure is about \$4000 per person plus air travel to Egypt and return from Israel. John still have received only 10 potential ambassadors' deposit of \$200 to date.

There are 8 spots available. If you are serious about going please send your check for \$200 made payable to FFGA promptly to John Wilhelm, Journey Coordinator. John suggests that you plan to arrive in Cairo on Oct.16 and have at least a night to recover from jet lag- Cairo is seven hours ahead of Atlanta. Here is the itinerary following the initial FF homestay in Cairo.

Day 1: October 24, 2018- Cairo / Aswan (flight) & Cruise Embarkation

Take the flight to Aswan. Arrive and transfer to Nile cruiser.

Embarkation & lunch on board of the cruise.

Proceed with the visits of Aswan including the Temple of Philae and tour around Elephantine Island & the Botanical Garden

Dinner & overnight on board of the cruise in Aswan.

Note: * Breakfast at the hotel and lunch & dinner on board the ship are included.

Day 2: October 25, 2018- Aswan / Kom Ombo / Edfu / Esna

Breakfast on board of the cruise.

Sail to Kom Ombo.

Visit the Temple of Kom Ombo, dedicated for Gods Sobek and Haroeris.

Sail to Edfu. Arrive Edfu andvisit the Temple of God Horus son of Osiris one of the most complete architectures in Edypt.

Sail to Esna Lock. Arrive Esna Lock, cross Esna lock and continue sailing to Luxor.

Dinner & overnight on board of the cruise.

Note: * Breakfast, lunch & dinner on board the ship are included.

Day 3: October 26, 2018- Luxor

Breakfast on board of the cruise.

Proceed with the visits of the West Bank of the Nile including The Valley of Kings, The Temple of Queen Hatshepsut at Deir El-Bahari and the two colossi of Memnon.

Overnight on board of the cruise in Luxor.

Note: * Breakfast, lunch & dinner on board the ship are included.

Day 4: October 27, 2018- Disembarkation & Luxor / Amman (flight via Cairo)

Breakfast and disembarkation from the cruise.

Finish with the visits of the East Bank of the Nile including the Temple of Karnak & the Temple of Luxor.

Transfer to Luxor Airport for your flight to Amman. Meet and assist at Queen Alia International Airport with all airport procedures and formalities via Customs & Emigration, drive to the Amman Hotel for overnight. (Breakfast included)

Day 5: October 28, 2018- Rose City, Petra

Depart to Petra. Full day visiting Jordan's Jewel, The Capital City of the Nabateans, a city fully carved in the rose red stones of Wadi Mousa Mountains. Upon arrival, you will take a horse back ride, walk through the Siq, the only access to this city. Overnight in Petra.

(Breakfast included)

Day 6: October 29, 2018- Departure

Transfer to the airport for your departure flight. End of our services. (Breakfast included)

ACCOMODATIONS OF THE PROGRAM:

Nile Cruiser: Solaris 2 is a 5 star standard ship. Accommodation is in standard cabin with outside view.

Amman: Corp Amman is a 4 star hotel in Amman. Accommodation in standard room. **Petra:** Petra Guest House is a 4 star hotel in Petra. Accommodation in standard room.

What is included?

All transfers mentioned in the itinerary. All accommodations at 4 star hotels including daily breakfast.

All sightseeing tours; including transportation by A/C comfortable mini-van, English speaking escort and entrance fees as mentioned in the itinerary. Local professional guides.

Flight tickets from Cairo to Aswan and Luxor to Amman.

4 days/3 nights Nile cruise on 5 star cruise ship including; accommodation, breakfast, lunch and dinner.

Sightseeing tours during the cruise. Horse ride for 800 meters at Petra. Local taxes.

What is not included?

Any tips to staff, items of a personal nature, drinks with meals. International arrival and departure flight tickets. Visas if needed.

ISRAEL EXTENSION

Day 1: October 29, 2018- Border Cross & Arrive Jerusalem

Border cross and transfer to hotel in Jerusalem for an overnight. (No meals)

Day 2: October 30, 2018- Jerusalem New City

Start the day with a panoramic view of Jerusalem from the top of Mt' of Olives. On to the Garden of Geth-semane and Church of the Agony. Continue to Israel Museum's Shrine of the Book with the famous Dead Sea scrolls, then a visit to the beautifully renovated Model of the Herodian city of Jerusalem, dating back to the time of the Second Temple. Continue to Yad Vashem (the memorial to the six million Jews who were killed in the Holocaust). Afternoon visit to the picturesque village of Ein Karem, the birth place of John the Baptist. Return to hotel. (Breakfast, dinner)

Day 3: October 31, 2018- Jerusalem Old City / Bethlehem*

Walk through one of the Gates to the walled Old City: the renewed Jewish Quarter; the Western Wall, the Temple area; the colorful bazaars; Via Dolorosa and the Stations of the Cross ending at the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. Drive to Mt' Zion and visit the tomb of King David, the Room of the Last Supper and Dormition Abbey. Afternoon continue to Bethlehem* to visit the Church of the Nativity and a view of the shepherds fields. Return to Jerusalem for overnight. (Breakfast, dinner)

Day 4: November 1, 2018- Beit Shean / Nazareth / Galilee

Leave Jerusalem and drive north via Jericho*, the oldest city in the world. Then via the Jordan Valley to Beit Shean. Visit the excavations of this beautiful Roman City. Proceed to Nazareth to visit the Church of the Annunciation & Mary's Well. On to Safed, city of the Kabala, for a walk through the mystic alleys and the artists' colony. Drive to Kibbutz Hotel for overnight. (Breakfast, dinner)

Day 5: November 2, 2018- Golan Heights / Sea of Galilee

Drive to the Golan Heights. See the former Syrian fortifications and the Druze villages. Via Banias, source of the Jordan River, drive to the shores of the Sea of Galilee, to Capernaum. Visit the ruins of the ancient synagogue and Peters House. Visit Tabgha, where the miracle of the Fish & Bread took place and Mt Beatitude. After a short tour of Tiberias the old center of Jewish learning, return to the Kibbutz Hotel for overnight. (Breakfast, dinner)

Day 6: November 3, 2018- Acre / Haifa / Tel Aviv

After Breakfast drive west to Acre for a visit of the old, famous Crusader stronghold and medieval fortifications. Continue to Haifa, sightseeing tour of Haifa, including the Bahai Shrine, Persian Garden and Mount Carmel for a panoramic view of the city. Proceed southwards to Caesarea to visit the Roman Theater and the Crusader fortress. Continue to Tel Aviv-Jaffa for a short city tour and to hotel for overnight. (Breakfast, dinner)

Day 7: November 4, 2018- Tel Aviv

Day at leisure in Tel Aviv or an optional tour to the Dead Sea. (Breakfast, dinner)

Day 8: November 5, 2018- Departure

Breakfast and transfer to the airport for departure. (Breakfast)
