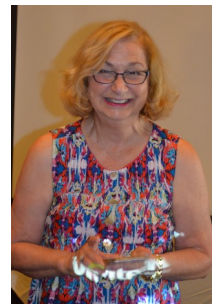
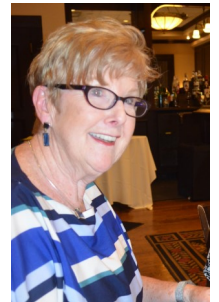




Italian food and a taste for visiting other lands

Judy Hausmann and Sue James are co-journey coordinators for the reciprocal exchange to Oregon's Mid Willamette Valley. The tentative agreed date of the seven-night homestay to Mid-Willamette Valley is the week of August 13, 2019.

The plan is to also visit Portland, where we will possibly have a short home stay followed by several nights in a hotel.

Willamette Valley is a 150-mile-long Valley in the Pacific Northwest. The valley is surrounded by mountains on three sides, the Cascades to the east and the Oregon Coastal range to the west, and Calapooya to the south.

The area is the cultural and political heart of Oregon, and is home to about 70 per cent of its population.

The area is named after the Willamette River that runs through it. It was the destination of choice for the wagon trains of emigrants who made the perilous journey west to the fertile valley.

The valley is often considered Oregon's wine country since it contains over 500 wineries. Some of the places of interest



are Silver Falls Park, Schreiner's Iris Gardens, Washington Park, Evergreen Aviation and Space Museum. Guests enjoy a waterfalls tour, wine tasting and winery tours.

Australia and Slovakia - 5 points

Peru and New Zealand - 4 points

Japan, United States (mainland), Uganda, and Hungary - 3 points

Taiwan, South Africa, and Turkey - 2 points

Mongolia, Nepal, Brazil, Ghana, Morocco, and Romania - 1 point
